

Autism in the Classroom - Half Day (3 Hours)

Overview

Having a diagnosis of autism often means that a person may find some aspects of daily life more difficult than other people. Commonly, children with autism can find the structure and routine of a classroom setting comforting, or conversely they can find it unsettling, over-stimulating and often over-whelming which can lead to behavioural issues and a decrease in learning opportunities.

The content offers a quick refresher on autism and identifies some of the common difficulties faced by those on the spectrum in educational settings — including the sensory environment, communication problems, predictability and behavioural difficulties.
