Overview

Any person who can reasonably be predicted to be at risk of being exposed to restrictive interventions must have an individualised *Positive Behaviour Support Plan* (Department of Health, 2014). A PBS Plan should serve various functions - primarily the overall goal is the improvement of the person's *quality of life* and making *behaviours of concern* irrelevant, inefficient or ineffective (Carr et al, 2002). The plan should also ensure everyone's safety should *behaviours of concern* occur. A PBS Plan should be guided by and understanding of the functions of the person's behaviour and identify ways to increases a person's skills or develop other patterns of behaviour.
